for the Polish language Institute CJP
Centrum języka polskiego**

One year ago our school selected among several language schools the **Centrum języka polskiego** to take up the task of giving a new outlook to the teaching of Polish as a foreign language to the age groups of 7 - 12-year-old students at our institution. In this process of selection teachers of the CJP had the possibility to attend Polish classes within the target group, but also voluntarily complied with our request to present some lessons with the same students themselves.

After one year of cooperation we are far more than fully satisfied with the results of the work of the CJP at the Willy-Brandt-Schule. With regard to the different age groups the respective communicative skills have been continuously developed in an atmosphere of kindness, fun and respect, never lacking the necessary discipline. As for now, Polish as a foreign language constitutes a highly attractive and rewarding subject at our school - a fact that is certainly due to the superior quality of the professional way of teaching by the CJP.

Moreover we would like to point out that the CJP not only faultlessly fulfilled our wishes based on structural requirements within the organisation of our school days, but also kept a stable staff working at our school in order to facilitate an effective student-teacher relation. We very much welcomed the fact that the CJP delegated teachers able to communicate in our school's everyday language, German. Not one single lesson of Polish had to be cancelled, not one single additional favor we asked - adapting to our system of marks, conceiving written assessments of the students abilities and progress, providing us with a curriculum for the school year or keeping records of attendance - was ever refused. The staff of the CJP have excellently blended into our school and are fully accepted by our teachers.

Thus, our cooperation with the CJP, a most reliable and highly competent and professional institution, has been an extremely fruitful, warm-hearted and rewarding one.
