

## Opinion on CJP

Two years ago I came to Poland – since then I am having Polish lessons with Dorota - for more than one year now in Centrum Języka Polskiego (CJP), which is partly owned by her.

She asked me to write an opinion on the Language School, which I am happy to do. I could tell you something about their system of teaching Polish and about professionalism, however I think they can better explain these things themselves.

I rather want to tell you that learning Polish in CJP is never boring – I am really looking forward to my language lessons!

I started to learn Polish already many years ago and had quite a hard time then – frankly speaking in the beginning I thought I would never manage! With lots of efforts I then learned some basic grammar and vocabulary.

Now I am improving my Polish with CJP and by working with tapes, card games, newspaper articles and such kind of things they manage that I really enjoy the lessons. Topics are up to date and interesting and never just pure grammar or vocabulary.

Last but not least I want to mention that I am really impressed by the way they are explaining things until everything is clear and understood. This seems to be quite basic, however I had about 7 different Polish teachers before and none of them really managed! Sometimes they did not know what is the rule and what the exception or if there is a rule at all. Sometimes the meaning of different Polish words is very close – CJP-teachers explain and give examples till you understand and “feel” the difference.
